PTFA 22/24 Events

With the continued guidance of the former committee members, this year has been an extremely successful first year of fundraising for the new team. The generosity of parents and children, combined with the support of the school staff and the volunteers who've contributed along the way have continued to astound the committee and will never be undervalued. While trialling one or two new ideas, we have continued with the popular events that our children look forward to each year including:

• Discos

The children have thoroughly enjoyed each of the 3 annual discos. We would like to extend thanks to resident DJ Guy Barker who continues to go above and beyond at each event, ensuring that no child is without their favourite floor filler. Likewise, we express our gratitude to all teachers and volunteers for their combined efforts in planning, setting up and running the discos. We have been blown away by the team spirit at each event, especially during the cleanup afterwards!

- The May 23 Beach Disco raised £1062.64
- The October 23 Spooky Disco raised a record breaking £1454.50

PTFA Spend

In addition, we contributed to year 6 leavers hoodies, and elements of their leaver's festival.
