How can we help?

We can offer:

- A listening ear
- Advice and strategies to support your family with challenging behaviour or attendance concerns
- Access to counselling from professional therapeutic services in school
- One-to-One support for children to help with confidence, self-esteem, bereavement, anger management, anxiety etc.
- Group support for children to help with friendships and social behaviours, eg. Lego Therapy
- Support in accessing free school meals

- Access to local food banks and charities who can support with other household needs such as furniture
- Advice regarding any SEND concerns you may have
- An Early Help Assessment (see below) to identify areas where you may benefit from support
- Referrals for parenting support
- Referrals to other agencies who can provide specialist help, such as the School Nursing Team, CAMHS, CFWS, Speech & Language Therapy and support to access these services
- Signposting to organisations who can support with housing, financial or mental health concerns and support to access these services

The right help at the right time

To ensure that your family will access the right level of support at the right time, we use the principles set out in the Working Well with Children and Families document.

A brief overview of the different levels of need can be found below:



Early Help Assessment

Sometimes children and their families might need some extra help and this might come from a range of different organisations, all working together.

An Early Help Assessment is a way of noting down what is going well in your family, what your worries are and what needs to happen to help things improve. Together with a Lead Professional, you will then agree the best way to make this happen; this will be written into a Family Help Plan and we will work closely with you to co-ordinate work alongside your child and family.

Regular Team Around The Family (TAF) meetings will be held to see how things are going for your family, to record the progress you make and to identify any further help you might need.

When can you ask for help?
