In addition to this we contributed £1320 to the school allotment project and a much needed new sports kit. A total of £7602 was then donated towards the work needed on the infant playground, including the new role play cabin. Our running costs for the year (insurance and stock) were £508.

We've been incredibly lucky to receive amazing support from the staff at Manor Road, the children, and their parents and carers throughout the year. Together, we've raised an impressive £12,050 for our children's school! We can't wait to see what the 2025/26 academic year will bring, should we be re-elected to continue in our roles.
