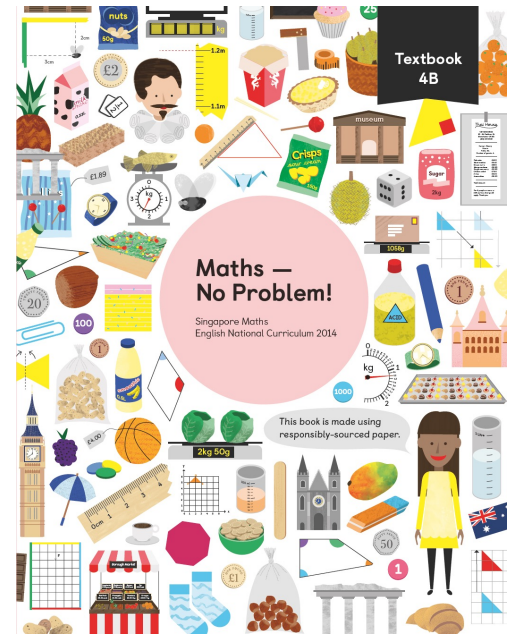
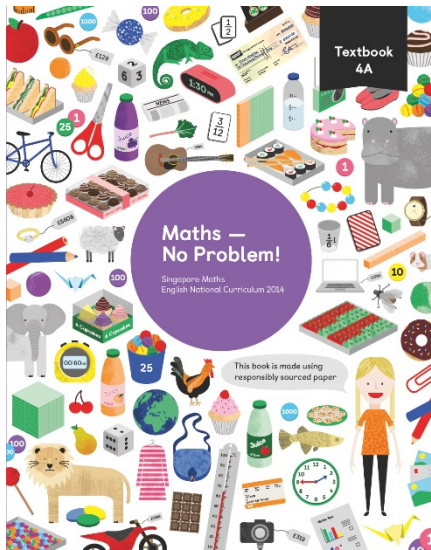
Reading, spelling and TTRS to be sent home via Dojos if relevant.
